

But Mary Magdalene stood weeping outside the tomb, and as she wept she stooped to look into the tomb..." John 20:11

There is a curious word, rare in the Bible, that is easily skipped. It is the word translated as "she stooped to look." The beloved disciple does it too in verse 5. But where the beloved disciple looked and left, Mary looked and lingered and so was the first to encounter the living Lord.

The curious word, "stooped to look," has the notion of a lover's longing look searching with desperate hope, yet holding breath of what might be. The beloved disciple stole a furtive glance and left. Mary searched with hopeful love—and encountered angels of good news!

The curious word also appears in The Song of Solomon. This book is a collection of love poems which can be understood as God's passionate, rapturous love for people that is verging on romance.

My beloved is like a gazelle. Look, there he stands behind our wall, gazing in at the windows, looking through the lattice. Song of Solomon 2:9

God is like a shy lover wanting to be near, hesitant, afraid of being turned away, yet not able to leave either.

Throughout history there has been speculation of what might have been between Jesus and Mary Magdalene. This curious word suggests it. But apart from that, Mary dared to peek into death, turned away from the tomb, turned toward Jesus, and saw love alive.





An Evening with Nadia Bolz Weber Monday, May 2, 2022

Are you interested in making connections between our faith and our complex, modern, real-world lives? Come listen and learn from Nadia Bolz-Weber who will be at neighboring St. Andrew's Lutheran Church (13600 Technology Drive, Eden Prairie MN) from 6-8pm the evening of Monday, May 2nd.

Join others from CTK and around our metro region as we re-align our spirits and re-ignite our leadership as people of faith and church leaders. We will hear a fresh presentation from New York Times Best-selling author, Nadia Bolz-Weber, whose authenticity of faith and willingness to look at the raw and unvarnished challenges head on still helps us find a word of promise. New York Times bestselling author Reverend Nadia Bolz-Weber has been called "a pastor for America's outsiders" (BBC). She will be the first to attest that she doesn't look like most people's idea of a pastor, but the community of faith she founded in Denver, Colorado—House for All Sinners and Saints—is a haven for a diverse community seeking affirmation and acceptance. In her books and talks, she makes the deeply felt argument that honesty and human connection are key to creating and sustaining community.

The event will be both live-in-person and streamed (live, and available on demand for one week following the event. In-person attendees are asked to be fully vaccinated, and local health guidance pertaining to masking, etc, will be followed as the situation requires.

These were some of the powerful messages of resistance and hope displayed on the posters carried by conference participants as they walked together on International Women's Day (March 8, 2022).

More than 30 Lutheran and Moravian women pastors and church leaders from the South-

ern Africa region gathered in person for the first time in two years for the LUCSA Gender Justice and Women's Empowerment Consultation in Johannesburg, South Africa from March 6-10. The theme of the conference was: "A Gender- just church today, for sustainable Mission tomorrow." Several of the pastors present were recognized and congratulated for their courage and faith being the very first women to be ordained in their respective churches.

The program included devotions, Bible studies, lively singing, guest speakers, group discussions and the sharing of stories of suffering, faith, hope and resistance in the face of gender-based violence, patriarchy, exploitation and inequality.

The ELCA is committed to accompanying companion churches as they faithfully engage in proclamation of the Gospel, mission outreach and work to mitigate the impact of poverty, HIV&AIDS, climate change, Gender-based violence, conflict and the COVID-19 pandemic in the communities they serve.

April Gift of Love Beacon/Families Moving Forward Sheltering Program

Congregations host families who are experiencing homelessness, extending hospitality and a warm, safe place to rest. Dedicated volunteers from more than 90 congregations throughout the Twin Cities metro area (including CTK) make hot meals, lead activities, and set up comfortable spaces to sleep as they host families overnight for a week at a time. However, due to Covid-19 safety precautions, families are currently being sheltered in a hotel in Chanhassen. Congregations continue to provide evening meals for the families at the hotel, and drop off food for breakfast and lunch at the Beacon Program Center. At this point, the plan is to resume sheltering the families in churches starting July 10th. During the day, families work with FMF case managers based on their unique needs, finding support as they transition from temporary shelter to an established home. At the Beacon Program Center in Chaska, parents may search for a new home, do laundry, go to work or search for a new job, while their children play or go to school. Through the entire experience, FMF staff foster an environment of dignity and resilience. Christ the King has supported FMF for over 40 years! Our prayers and financial gifts are needed even more now, to help cover the additional costs of sheltering families in hotels, rather than with congregations. Your prayers and financial gift of love are greatly appreciated!
