Hello Neighbors!

Beginning this month, council president Chris Gabel, Sean Johnson, Naomi Bernier, Caitlyn Johnson and I will be embarking on a new adventure! We will be joining other congregation members and faith leaders from across the Twin Cities, greater Minnesota, and even as far away as Eugene, Oregon, as part of the next learning cohort of Augsburg University's Riverside Innovation Hub.

Over the next two years, this group of wonderful folks will work together with the team of facilitators and faculty of Augsburg's Christiansen Center for Vocation to learn and explore what it means to be a "Public Church". Here is how the folks at the Riverside Innovation Hub describe what that means: A public church is committed to place based vocational discernment in the public square for the common good. In other words, our partner churches are pursuing God's call for them to be in relationship with their local neighborhoods in ways that bring flourishing and life. If you, like me, are a more visual learner, here's a great graphic that helps define what this work will look like:

The movement into the neighborhood in order to hear the neighbors' stories. In this movement, we learn to engage and listen to the neighbor for the neighbor's sake.

The movement into God's story and the congregation's biblical and theological commitments. We learn how our theological commitments shape our understanding of our neighbors' stories and how our neighbors' stories shape our understanding of our theological commitments.

The movement back into the neighborhood, this time prepared to proclaim good news in word and deed with our neighbors. In this movement, we learn how to boldly speak the truth of Jesus Christ in ways that challenge the way people in our neighborhoods are suffering.

The movement into the space between our neighbors' stories, God's story, and our story. In this movement, we learn how to listen for who God is calling us to be and what God is calling us to do in light of the present reality and God's promises.

It's September! Have You Found Your People Yet?

With the start of the program year, CTK resumes a full rehearsal schedule of music teams: the Acclaim Worship Band; Chapel Ringers; and Trinity Choir.

- · Students received scholarships to participate in clubs, sports and activities including field trips.

July 2023 Treasurer's Report

July 2023 total income was \$120,892.68 and disbursements were \$56,552.84 making us ahead for the month by \$64,339.84. This surge of income is largely due to the Employee Retention Credit we received. This ERC was a federal refundable tax credit available to organizations that had kept employees during the pandemic. We had budgeted for this credit but only estimated when it would be received ... July was the month. Year to date, our actual income is \$419,992.97 with expenses being \$404,452.44. This puts us ahead for the year by \$15,540.53. We are grateful for your financial support and for all the many ways you tend to our life together and to the work God calls us to do.
