

New Endeavors on the Horizon

This past summer I have been discerning with our CTKB Council an exciting new opportunity for my career in ministry and pondering the question of additional certification or schooling, in particular around the practice of Spiritual Direction. With the council's blessing, I have accepted an offer into a doctoral program at United Theological Seminary and will begin coursework this coming January for a Doctorate of Ministry in Spiritual Direction.

This program will grant me the opportunity to bring to a new culmination a variety of threads which have woven themselves throughout my work as a pastor and spiritual leader over the last dozen years. The first is a love and affection for the mystical traditions and the practice of spiritual direction. The second is work in the intersections of play, theology, and practical ministry. Another is the joy I find in one-to-one pastoral counseling and discipleship. Yet another is directing organizations and small groups through processes of discernment and self-actualization. Engaging in the work of the DMin in Spiritual Direction program will grant me the intellectual space to draw these various threads together into a more cohesive whole while also setting me up to carry forth the weaving of this tapestry throughout the rest of my career in ministry.

Throughout this discernment process, I only wanted to move forward with this doctoral program with the blessing of you, my congregation. I hope for this to be a journey we embark on together, and look forward to sharing much of my learning in a variety of ways here at CTKB. As part of their blessing and support, our council has agreed to reduce my hours here down to .8 time and grant me the additional time to engage in my studies and coursework. I will work with the council and staff on exactly what that time reduction looks like, and likely it will change and adjust throughout the program.

Finally, this is not the only "new endeavor" coming in 2024. This last month we received news that we have been granted a Lilly Foundation grant for Clergy & Congregational Renewal in Summer 2024. Come to the Open Forum on Oct 22nd to learn more about this time of sabbatical and get ready to have an awful lot of fun. I am excited about these new opportunities and look forward to your questions, conversation, and dialogue in the month ahead!

Wednesday, October 4th, we will hold our Blessing of the Animals service at 6:00PM. This event allows us a time to give thanks to God for the companionship that our pets give us. For the care and love of all of our pets and animal friends, the pastors will bless each pet whether they have fur, feathers or scales. We are asking that

when you bring your pet for blessing you also bring a pet food or treat which will be given to VEAP for their shelves. VEAP services 125-150 families a day and over 20% of them look for food for their pets – especially older folks whose only companion may be a dog or cat. And this pet food donation doesn't only need to be on the night of the Blessing. When you bring your regular food donations for VEAP on Sundays, now and then include something for the animals even if you don't have a pet yourself. Pastor Rory or Per will bless your pet and the VEAP donation will go to help take care of the pets of our friends and neighbors who need assistance.





Reconciling in Christ (RIC) Update and News

The purpose of the RIC Program is to ensure the welcome, inclusion, celebration, and advocacy for people of all sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions; work for racial equity and commit to anti-racist work and support the na-



tional program. Christ the King is in the process of exploring the possibility of becoming an RIC church. There have been newsletter articles, starting last fall, with information on the LGBTQAI+ letters (what do they all mean?) and our ongoing process. Many of you have been contacted via phone or in person conversations for input. Our team has written several drafts of our welcome statement, which were and are available for comment, and have also had two open forums on the topic. The team along with many other CTK members attended Bloomington Pride on September 10 wearing our "This Lutheran Loves You" shirts.

In the next few months we want to continue to engage and inform the entire congregation about this process, answer questions, and proceed to a vote at our annual meeting. There will be an Open Forum on October 8 with a panel from three nearby Lutheran churches who have all become RIC churches. They will discuss their experience with the process, and there will be an opportunity for you to ask questions.

Also during October there will be book study led by Pr. Rory on the book "Transforming: The Bible and the Lives of Transgender Christians" by Austen Hartke and recommended by an Open Forum presenter. The book study will meet on Wednesday evenings from 7-8 PM. Sign up links are in the Bulletin and on Constant Contact. In November/December look in the mail for a survey to gain input from the entire congregation about becoming an RIC church. Our hope is to have the final welcome statement completed in the next few months, and to have a final discussion and approval at the annual meeting in January.

This is an ongoing process as we work to be a welcoming congregation for everyone. We appreciate your input and questions and further conversations on the RIC process.

August Treasurer's Report

August 2023 total income was \$42,485.26 and disbursements were \$53,480.73 making us behind for the month by \$-10,995.47. Year to date, our actual income is \$462,478.23 with expenses being \$457,933.17. This puts us ahead for the year by \$4,545.06. In addition to the *ERC* credit received in July, we've had some other good financial news over the summer. Thanks to a generous bequest from Clayton Gardner's estate, we have been able to retire the remaining \$100,000 of our mortgage with Thrivent Financial! We still have a 40K loan from the CTK Foundation to pay off to be fully debt free from our renovation project 12 years ago, but this is a big step in the right direction! We are grateful for your financial support and for all the many ways you tend to our life together and to the work God calls us to do.
