Reinhardt George Andreas Ohmann, age 84, of Bloomington, passed away unexpectedly on Monday, February 23, 2026. After serving in the Army in Korea, Rein was an accountant with the State of Minnesota for most of his career. Rein is survived by his wife of 55 years Beverly, sons Marc (Angie), Chad (Heather), 7 beloved grandchildren and great-grandchildren and preceded in death by his son Eric, and brother Herman.


On March 21, 1941, Rein was born at home on a small dairy farm in Eagan Township near Lexington and Diffley. He grew up on that farm, as the second oldest of seven children. There they thrived in a life without indoor plumbing or electricity, learning the value of hard work and husbandry. Rein attended Trinity Lone Oak and Rosemount High school and later graduated from the University of Minnesota with a bachelor's degree in business.

Rein enlisted in the Army and served in active duty from January 21, 1964 through January 20, 1967 reaching a rank of Specialist Four (E-4) serving as a 71H20 Personnel Specialist in Korea.

After returning home, Rein reconnected with his future bride Beverly Hallcock of Castle Rock, whom he met through a chance encounter two years before enlisting. They were wed on June 26, 1970 and resided in their Bloomington home since - rarely spending a night apart.

In October 1973, they welcomed their first son Eric, into the world, three years later their second son Marc was born, followed by Chad, in 1980. With a growing family, Rein quickly took to excavating the yard with a shovel to build an addition on the house. For fifty-five years, Rein took great pride in maintaining the home, building gardens, collecting rain water, and teaching his seven grand and great-grandchildren, Samantha, Alex, Miali, Jackson, Mariana, Henry, and Annon how to work a shovel, trowel cement, spit watermelon seeds, and nurture the landscape.

He will be greatly missed.
